1. Olmsted Commons project, a motion was made by Mr. Sarno, second by Mrs. Kessler, to authorize payment to the contractor in the amount of \$60,400. Motion carried. He also stated that with this payment, a balance of \$17,497.00 remains due to the contractor.

Ladies and Gentlemen,

The following are my requested agenda items for the Monday, January 6, 2025 Council meeting:

- 1. Olmsted Commons Park Development Project Thanks to our efforts and the contractor's donation of work to the project, DCNR has announced that this will release the full grant amount and allow the Borough to request \$32,700 at this time. Note that 10% (\$15,100) is held until the project is closed out which the Borough will need to cover. With the \$27,700 already received from the second half of the grant money and \$32,700 available, this will equal the full grant amount including the 10%. Requesting authorization to submit the second request for partial payment of \$32,700 and to revise approval of Payment No. 3 to the contractor up to as much as currently available at this time. Note that a small punch list remains for items to be completed when the weather permits. Please continue in the effort to raise funds for this project to offset the Borough's costs. Once we confirm final amounts, we can discuss meeting with the Legislators to request additional assistance, if needed. Please see the email and letter from Cheri Matter of DCNR regarding the items needed for final inspection and close-out.
- 2. <u>2024 CDBG Project</u> Request authorization to advertise bids to be opened at the March meeting (unless already noted in January 6, 2025 meeting minutes).
- Casino Theater and Library Building Improvements Phase 2 (LSA Grant) We are nearly ready with this project as follows: Bid 1 Finish Masonry Repointing and Sealing, Bid 2 Window Replacement 15 Each, Bid 3 Interior Plaster Repair in Library 1,300 SF. Request authorization to advertise bid opening in March or April.
- 4. <u>1st Commonwealth Bank Sign Upgrade</u> Discussion regarding the need for a Zoning Variance and Hearing before the sign permit can be issued.
- 5. <u>WCHA Easement Agreement Request</u> Discuss / Authorize approval of Easement Agreement. See emailed correspondence dated 1-28-2025 and attachments.
- 6. <u>Ninth Street Retaining Wall Replacement Project</u> (CEAP Grant) Drilling to proceed when weather permits.
- 7. 104 West Adams Parallel Parking Request Upon receiving no responses to my 1-9-2025 email correspondence to the Board regarding this request, I am of the opinion there is no desire to allow this type of special parking arrangement. Therefore I will inform the property owner that an application with the proposed arrangement will not be approved since it does not meet the ordinance in respect to, among other things the Site distance Visibility Limitations, the Driveway does not form a 90° angle with the street or as near as possible, and especially due to the concerns about Double Parking of vehicles under different ownership.
- 8. <u>Peoples Gas Request for 2025 Street Paving List</u> PNG has requested this information by 3-31-2025. Please advise of any plans for paving other than CDBG's.
- 9. PNG Gas Line Replacement Projects
 - a. Whittier Street Project Planned to start in January 2025.
 - b. Longfellow 2025 Project Planned to start in January 2025.

- 2. A motion was made by Mrs. Kessler, second by Mr. Sarno, to direct the Engineer to advertise for bids regarding the 2024 CDBG Street Reconstruction Project for the March 3rd meeting. Motion carried.
- 3. A motion was made by Mr. Sarno, second by Ms. Bruner, to direct the Egngineer to advertise for bids on the Casino/Library Renovation Project for the March 3rd meeting. Motion carried.
- 5. A motion was made by Ms. Bruner, second by Mr. Sarno, to adopt Resolution No. 4-2025, which an Easement Agreement between the Borough and the Westmoreland County Housing Authority at the WCHA's Emerson Court Property. Motion carried. (See page 4-A)
- 6. Engineer Bove stated that drilling at the 9th Street retaining wall proceed as the weather permits.
- 7. In regards to the request for parallel parking at 104 West Adams Avenue, Engineer Bove stated that it does not meet the requirements in the ordinance, and therefore, recommends that this matter be denied.

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOROUGH OF VANDERGRIFT, COUNTY OF WESTMORELAND AND COMMONWEALTH OF PENNSYLVANIA, APPROVING EASEMENT AGREEMENT WITH THE WESTMORELAND COUNTY HOUSING AUTHORITY FOR 90-96 EMERSON COURT, VANDERGRIFT, PENNSYLVANIA 15690

WHEREAS, the Borough of Vandergrift owns property, which is more specifically identified as Tax Map Parcel Identification Number 42-14-09-0-010; and,

WHEREAS, the Westmoreland County Housing Authority ("WCHA") owns property located at 90-96 Emerson Court, Vandergrift, Pennsylvania 15690, which is more specifically identified as Tax Map Parcel Identification Number 37-01-09-0-721; and,

WHEREAS, the above referenced properties are adjacent to one another, sharing a boundary line on the easterly side of WCHA's property, and westerly side of Vandergrift's property; and,

WHEREAS, a portion of vehicle driveway on Vandergrift's property protrudes over WCHA's property, encroaching upon WCHA's property; and,

WHEREAS, WCHA is willing to grant an easement over WCHA's property to Vandergrift, for the encroachment of the driveway on Vandergrift's property crossing over the portion of WCHA's property, with all costs related to the preparation of the required easement agreement being borne WCHA;

NOW THEREFORE, the Borough of Vandergrift does hereby resolve as follows:

RESOLVED, that the Borough of Vandergrift shall execute the attached Easement Agreement in order to receive the proposed easement over WCHA property as set forth above.
